ARRIVAL CHECKLIST

(FOR EXCHANGE STUDENTS ON CAMPUS OF ZWICKAU)

How to prepare for your stay

- check entry requirements and apply for a visa if needed
proof of financial support for Non-EU students only (€853 per month)!!!
- book flight/train tickets
- reserve a room in the student accommodation

2 months
in advance

Please inform your Tutor about:

- Arrival time - you should arrive on weekdays between 09.00 and 19.00, in the summer and winter semester one week before the courses start.
- whether you will take part in the German Intensive Course in September
- We have estimated the approximate expenses for the first few days in Zwickau which comes to around €1000. This does **not** include expenses to basic necessities such as food or materials etc.
- Ensure you have enough **cash** (euros), as **the first days are very expensive** (rent & deposit, health insurance etc.)
- Ensure you have all the relevant documents ready

Make sure that you bring along

- Any specific medication you need
- Emergency contact addresses, phone numbers
- Plug adaptors
- Passport/ ID card and passport photos
- International driving licence (if needed)
- bed linen/duvet/pillow

1-2 weeks
before

Contact your Tutor at the university.

- Inform them about your arrival time and provide them with a telephone number for contact whilst travelling
- If you wish that your tutor picks up your dorm-room key before your arrival in Zwickau, then your tutor requires a power of attorney and a copy of your rental contract.

1. Get your room key

Costs: deposit (€380) + rent (between €200 and €270)

3. Register at the city hall (Rathaus)

- you must register with the city at the city hall (Rathaus)
- this can be found at the „Hauptmarkt“ with the department „Meldebehörde“
- Bring your **passport and „Wohnungsgeberbestätigung (WGB)“**

4. Matriculation to study

(Student Secretariat, Dezernat Studienangelegenheiten, PKB 221, cf. map)

1st-2nd
day

- the semester fees are around **€252** for studying in Zwickau and about **€85,60** for studying in Markneukirchen, Schneeberg, or Reichenbach
- pay for the German Intensive Course at cash office PKB 136 (if you have signed up for this)
- At the Student Secretariat PKB 221 (see map) you will need to show:
 - copy of your visa (Non EU-students)
 - proof of payment for the semester (receipt)
 - copy of your health insurance confirmation for the whole study-period

You receive the following documents after enrolment:

- Student ID card
- Statement of enrolment (Immatrikulationsbescheinigung)
- Application form for network services (ZKI, Nutzerdienste)

5. Register with ZKI (Network Services)

2nd - 3rd

- bring the **completed form (filled out) for network services** to room GAB 219 (see map) to register for the university network and get access to the internet
- there is another application form which **has to be filled out by the administration of the student accommodation** which you can complete when signing your rental contract

7. Open a bank account in Germany

1st - 2nd
week

- Has to be done by every Non-EU student/ students who don't have a IBAN number.
- Some banks have special accounts for your stay in Germany and have experiences with foreign students (f.e. Commerzbank, Deutsche Bank "Jugendkonto" or "Sperrkonto" – blocked account)
- If you already have a blocked account (at least 853 € per month), you just need to activate it with a document you can find online.

The following requirements only apply to **non-EU citizens**

8. Register at the Registration Office for Foreigners

1st - 2nd

Register with the Foreigners' Registration Office
(Ausländermeldebehörde)

When you are from a non-EU country with a visa shorter than your time in Germany, you need to apply for residence permit.

The following documents are required:

- Completed application form with a biometric passport photo
- Copy of the valid visa
- Copy of your health insurance certificate
- Copy of your rental contract
- Statement of enrollment
- Proof of financial support in Germany (€853 per month, blocked bank account)
- Administrative fee €100 (exception: scholarship holders)

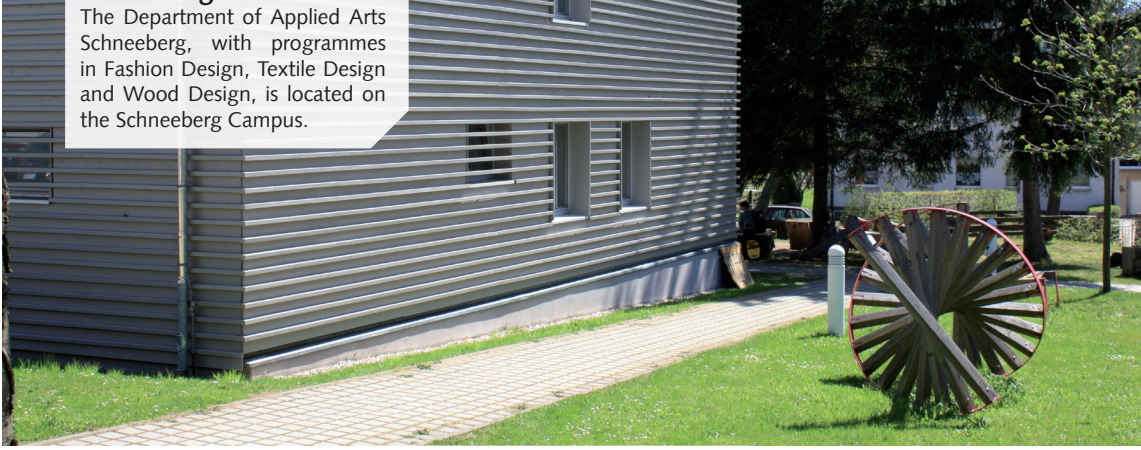


Zwickau: Scheffelstraße Campus

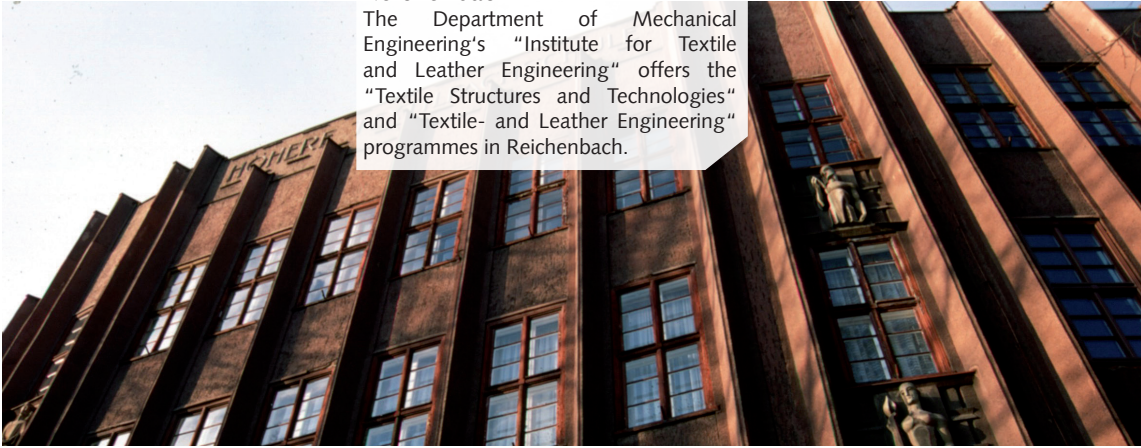
Schneeberg

DEPARTURE CHECKLIST

(FOR EXCHANGE STUDENTS ON CAMPUS OF ZWICKAU)

1. Give notice of departure

1 week
in advance

- Fill out the form „Antrag auf Exmatrikulation“ (application for exmatriculation)
- Submit your form to the Dezemat Studienangelegenheiten (Student Secretariat)
- Deactivate Student Card in the Mensa (Cafeteria) and request remaining money (paid in cash)
- Return all borrowed books to the library

2. Cancel your Health Insurance in Germany

(Important for Non-EU-citizens)

4 weeks
in advance

- Cancel your German health insurance.
- Make sure that there is no unpaid balance.

3. Contact the International Office

1 week
in advance

- The office needs to sign the Departure Confirmation form for your home institution (if needed)
- Apply for the Transcript of Records (state your domestic address so that the document can be send to this address)

4. Cancel registration with the Residents' Registration Office

(Meldebehörde, Rathaus)

2 weeks
in advance

The required documents are:

- proof of identification (passport)

5. Contact the Student Residence Office to cancel rental contract

2 weeks
in advance

- Fill out the checklist „Laufzettel für den Auszug“
- Make sure you have contacted all required offices before departing

6. Contact facility management to return your room key

4 - 5 days
in advance

- Fill out the checklist „Laufzettel für den Auszug“ for facility management
- Return the keys

7. Close your bank account in Germany

2 weeks
in advance

- Go to your bank and cancel the account (you will get the money left in cash)
- If you have a blocked account, you will need a release certificate from the embassy.

8. Student exchange markets in dormitory Zwickau

June - July

Student exchange markets can be used to leave items you cannot take home and which you do not longer need (e.g. bed linen, books) to offer them to other students.
